

Kalanchoe (*Kalanchoe blossfeldiana*)

- Full sun, water-retaining. Tolerates temperature changes

Lavender (*Lavandula*)

- Smaller varieties better indoors, bright light

Lipstick Plant (*Aeschynanthus pulcher*)

- Warm temperature, medium to bright light

Orchid (*Orchidaceae*)

- Low light, thrives in humidity, water every week or week and a half

Oxalis (*Oxalidaceae*)

- Bright light, allow to dry out

Peace Lily (*Spathiphyllum*)

- Low light, tolerates overwatering, toxic to dogs and cats

Geranium (*Pelargonium*)

- Ample sun, moderate watering

Happy Bean Plant (*Peperomia ferreyrae*)

- Bright, indirect sunlight, water sparingly

Hens-and-Chicks (*Sempervivum tectorum*)

- Full to part sun, let soil dry between watering

Jade Plant (*Crassula ovata*)

- Full sun, keep soil moist

Pebble Plant (*Lithops*)

- Bright light, water sparingly

String of Bananas (*Senecio radicans*)

- Full indirect sun, water every 2-3 weeks

String of Pearls (*Senecio rowleyanus*)

- Bright, indirect sunlight, let dry between waterings

Swiss Cheese Plant (*Monstera deliciosa*)

- Can tolerate most levels of sun, needs regular watering

Paddle Plant (*Kalanchoe thyrsiflora*)

- Bright light, allow top 2 inches of soil to dry between watering

Panda Plant (*Kalanchoe tomentosa*)

- Deep but infrequent watering, medium to low light

Pencil Cactus (*Euphorbia tirucalli*)

- Full sun, water every 2-3 weeks in summer

Pothos (*Epipremnum aureum*)

- Can tolerate a wide variety of lighting

Star Window Plant (*Haworthia cuspidata*)

- Low light, water sparingly

Zebra cactus (*Haworthia attenuate*)

- Full, indirect sun, let dry between waterings

Succulents and Other

Air plants (*Tillandsia*)

- Submerge in water for 2-3 hours every 10 days

Aloe (*Aloe vera*)

- Indirect light, thorough watering every 1-2 weeks

Asparagus Fern (*Asparagus officinalis*)

- Tolerates both bright light and shade, keep soil moist

Burro's Tail (*Sedum morganianum*)

- Water thoroughly and regularly, bright light

Indoor Plants

Even if you're unable to maintain a full outdoor garden, or you just don't have the space, you can still enjoy the beauty and benefits of plants with these indoor varieties.

Low light

Bird's Nest Fern (*Asplenium nidus*)

- Keep soil moist

Cast-Iron Plant (*Aspidistra elatior*)

- Minimal watering needed

Chinese Evergreen (*Aglaonema*)

- Tolerates overwatering

Chinese Money Plant (*Pilea peperomioides*)

- Water weekly

Dieffenbachia (*Dieffenbachia amoena*)

- Indirect light

Dragon tree (*Dracaena draco*)

- Water once soil has dried out - toxic to animals

Lucky Bamboo (*Dracaena sanderiana*)

- Dim indirect light, grow in water

Peperomia (*Peperomia obtusifolia*)

- Water sparingly, allow soil to dry up to 5 inches deep

Philodendron (*Philodendron bipinnatifidum*)

- Water once a week

Prayer Plant (*Maranta leuconeura*)

- Keep soil moist, part to full shade

Snake Plant (*Sansevieria trifasciata*)

- Tolerates drought up to a month

Zebra Plant (*Aphelandra squarrosa*)

- Minimal watering required

“ZZ” Plant (*Zamioculcas*)

- Tolerates drought and low humidity

Bright Light

English Ivy (*Hedera helix*)

- Keep moist

Ficus Tree (*Ficus benjamina*)

- Indirect light, water every 4-7 days

Fiddle Leaf Fig (*Ficus lyrata*)

- Indirect light, water generously in hot months

Money Tree (*Pachira aquatica*)

- Indirect light, water frequently

Ponytail Palm (*Beaucarnea recurvata*)

- Needs less frequent waterings

Rubber Plant (*Ficus elastica*)

- Indirect light, keep moist

Spider Plant (*Chlorophytum comosum*)

- Water weekly

Umbrella Plant (*Cyperus alternifolius*)

- Let dry between waterings

Yucca (*Yucca filamentosa*)

- Water sparingly

Flowering Plants

African Violet (*Saintpaulia*)

- Bright indirect light and moist soil

Anthurium (*Anthurium andraeanum*)

- Medium to bright light

Begonia (*Begonia semperflorens*)

- Minimal watering, part sun

Bromeliad (*Bromeliaceae*)

- Keep moist, bright indirect light

Cape Primrose (*Streptocarpus*)

- Keep lightly moist, bright indirect light

Christmas Cactus (*Schlumbergera*)

- Water only when dry, bright indirect light

Crown of Thorns (*Euphorbia milii*)

- Full sun, minimal watering

Flowering Maple (*Abutilon*)

- Keep soil evenly moist, bright light

Guppy plant (*Nematanthus*)

- Keep moderately dry, medium to bright light

Hibiscus (*Hibiscus rosa-sinensis*)

- Provide as much sun as possible, keep soil moist

Impatiens (*Impatiens walleriana*)

- Bright indirect sun, temperatures over 55 degrees

Jasmine (*Jasminum*)

- Bright light, variety depends on local climate

Kaffir lily (*Clivia miniata*)

- Let dry between watering, medium light
